INTRODUCING THE UNITED STATES ACADEMIC DECATHLON®

Academic Decathlon®, the premier national scholastic competition for high school students, was created to provide opportunities for students to experience the challenges of rigorous team and individual competition. The USAD curriculum addresses a number of National Education Content & Curriculum Standards (<http://usad.org/Curriculum/Standards.asp>). Each student competes in ten events, which are Economics, Essay, Art, Interview, Language and Literature, Math, Music, Science, Social Science and Speech. Each year the Science or Social Science topic is designated for the Super Quiz topic.

The ten-event academic program strives to foster a greater respect for knowledge, to promote wholesome inter-school academic competition, and to further develop student communication skills. A unique aspect of Academic Decathlon is that it is designed to include students from all academic abilities. Each nine-member team consists of three "A" (Honor), three "B" (Scholastic) and three "C or below" (Varsity) students. A new theme of study is established every year with topics that are relevant and challenging. Gold, silver, and bronze medals are awarded for individual events and total scores. Overall individual winners are recognized as well as champion teams. This very broad base of awards allows for major recognition of academic accomplishment.

In many schools, tryouts for team positions occur in the fall after summer study sessions. Thus, substantially more than nine students can be involved in each school's program. Teams advance through local, regional and state levels of competition. The state champions compete at the national finals.

The national competition is hosted by a different state each year. Over 300 volunteers are involved as judges and proctors for the competition, including staff from many of the USAD sponsoring organizations. There are currently programs in over 40 states. The possibilities for growth are endless.

Small, Medium, & Large Schools Virtual National Competitions

The goal of the USAD® Small, Medium, & Large Schools Virtual Competitions is to bring learning, growth and recognition of USAD® to more schools & students across the United States.

- ✓ A state must have a current Academic Decathlon® program.
- ✓ Small School enrollment of competing school is not to exceed 650 (grades 9–12).
- ✓ Medium School enrollment of competing school is 651-1,300 (grades 9–12).
- ✓ Large School enrollment of competing school is ≥1,301 (grades 9-12)
- ✓ Schools participating in the small/medium/large schools online competition must NOT be the same team participating in the USAD National Finals.
- ✓ Teams in each competing state will be selected and certified by the State Director. (*The USAD National office will do the certification if a state does not have a State Director.*)
- ✓ The USAD Online Competition will be held the same days as the National competition.
- ✓ Number of events (9): Essay, Language & Literature, Art, Music, Math, Science, Social Science, Economics, and Speech.
